

Join Campbell County Extension & 4-H at the 10th Annual Heritage Festival! Lots of fun educational, games and activities along with contests. The event will be held on October 6, 2018 from 10:00 a.m.-5:00 p.m. at the Community Park Pavilion by WCCS; 294 William Campbell Drive. Gladys, VA 24554. There are numerous 4-H Sponsored Contests available at the Heritage Festival: Minibooth, Graphic Design, Poster Contest, Adult & youth Photography Contest: Enrollment in 4-H is not required to take part in the contests.

Minibooth Exhibits can be entered in 4 areas of interest: Agricultural (Heritage), Environmental Science, Nutrition or Farm to Table, Other Special Interest. Participants (individual or team of two) can prepare the minibooth in advance by using two poster or foam core boards. In addition, the minibooth includes an area for 3D items in the floor of the exhibit. Although the registration for the minibooth needs to be received on or before September 20, the actual exhibit does not need to be delivered until the day before the Festival, October 5. The frame for the exhibits are provided. Best in Show rosettes and 1st-5th place ribbons will be awarded.

Graphic Design Contest consists of two subject areas Heritage Festival Promotion and 4-H Promotion. Simply, through the use of a computer create a design that promotes the Heritage Festival or the 4-H program. The Logos for either program can be obtained by contacting Campbell County 4-H. The entry can be mailed or delivered. Best in Show rosettes and 1st- 5th place ribbons will be awarded.

Photography Contest includes youth and adult levels as well as four classes: Color, Monochrome, Altered and Heritage.

Photos must have been taken by the participate entering the photo and must abide by the contest rules including mounting, which can be done by placing photo on a slightly more sturdy surface that can extend beyond the photo or be flush with the photo. Registration must be received by September 20, but entered item can be mailed or delivered. Best in Show rosettes and 1st t- 3rd place ribbons will be awarded.

- *Prizes and ribbons to be awarded and winners will be featured at The Heritage Festival!
- *Create a poster featuring fresh food. Choose at least one food grown in Virginia. Include a nutrition fact about a food.
- *Hand draw your creation on a piece of paper or cardstock (8 % x 11). No copyrighted characters or computer generated text.
- *Open to youth ages 9-19 as of September 30, 2018.
- *Entries will be accepted at the Campbell County 4-H Office or any branch of the Campbell County Public Library from August 31 to September 21.
